


I go inside the classroom and see kids playing. One, two, three, four. There are four new friends here already.










I see windows. How many do I see? Help me count the windows in my classroom.

I count the chairs around my table. How many chairs are there? Help me count the chairs.




I want to play with something different. I look around my classroom and see markers and paper. I love to color. I count the markers. One, two, three, four, five, six. There are six markers.

- the artwork in the halls
